

The festival of Holi is one of the major festivals of India. This festival covers in it many spiritual mysteries, but these days many people set aside morality and spirituality while celebrating it. They resort to such a manner that encourages eve-teasing and disorder because of which both in India and abroad, many civilized people have started even hating it. We must know the real and spiritual significance of Holi and celebrate it in a dignified manner, so that it may give a new direction to mankind.

The method of Celebrating Holi

The festival of Holi which follows the festival of Shiv Jayanti, falls on the full moon night of the Phagun month of Hindu calendar year. The people celebrate it in four ways: 1. They colour each other, i.e., inspire one and all to synchronize their *sanskars* and nature. 2. They burn the bonfire of Holika, which symbolises the burning of their vices and negative tendencies, habits and attitudes. 3. On this day, they meet and greet each other in ecstatic manner which inspire us to make the feeling of jealousy and enmity vanish from within, from its root, 4. Many people depict Shri Krishna swinging in the swing, which symbolically teaches that like Shri Krishna, we should also keep swinging in the swing of super-sensuous joy. Now, let us concentrate on the date and above-mentioned rituals of this festival.

In India, the month of Phagun ends on the full moon night. The burning of bonfire of Holika in the full moon night of Phagun month stands for burning of mistakes and bad thoughts of the past year in the fire and a firm resolve to remain happy and joyous from the first month of the forthcoming year, and follow purity/celibacy because everything gets purified when it is immersed into the fire.

In addition to this, celebrating this festival at the end of every year hints at the fact that this festival was celebrated at the fag-end of the Kalpa, in Kaliyuga, after which Golden-Aged World of Peace and Happiness ensued and the sorrows, disease, disquiet and poverty also came to an end. **But we** (...*Contd. on Page No. 34*)

he Avyakt Murli of 27th February 2014 offered a few significant, subtle Godly signals. The following elevated versions are worth noting: "Keep expanding on spiritual services as much as possible because anything can happen suddenly. Therefore, keep increasing the levels of service as your own sovereignty has to be established. In the perfect and complete kingdom, you will enjoy your own sovereignty". To be worthy of being rulers of the Golden-Aged sovereignty, the power of 100% positive thoughts is the criteria. There is an old saying, "A person who has conquered his mind can conquer the world". And it is also a common understanding that our mind is like a flying horse, and keeps flying from one thing to another in the matter of a fraction of a second. To control one's mind there is need for very subtle, concentrated effort during meditation.

The experiences of those practising Rajyoga Meditation happen to be culminating towards that cherished goal with regular practice and dedicated motivation. We aim to live up to the expectations of the Supreme Father taking courage from the fact that the Divine wouldn't ask us to do something if it was not possible!

When we recall our age-old places of worship and deeply loved deities, we praise Shri Lakshmi and Shri Narayan (Shri Radhe and Shri Krishna in childhood respectively) as rulers of the world in Golden Age or *Satyuga*, but let's truly think about how they attained this supreme status.

The answer lies in another saying, "Nar Aisi Karni Kare Jo Shri Narayan Pad Prapt Kare" meaning the souls of Shri Lakshmi and Shri Narayan must have practised that art of living practical Rajyogi lives at the end of the Iron Age (Kaliyug). But interestingly, this very fact would be forgotten by Shri Lakshmi and Shri Narayan due to certain factors or reasons in the World Drama. It is only now that we are made cognizant of the essential facts of this age of Transformation.

Present day politics and chaotic scenes in different parts of the globe including relentless

civil wars compel political thinkers to think seriously about the future of the world. The rising tensions are compelling the super powers to continue refining and piling up their nuclear weapons; this has led to a very delicate and dangerous situation in many parts of the world. 
Q. God opens our intellect through knowledge. What is the method to keep one's intellect pure and clean?

If you have true love for God, your mind will never go anywhere else. Mamma's mind never wandered anywhere. She focused on the One: Manmanabhav (Realising self as soul and remembering one God). We saw Brahma Baba in the form of penance (tapasya) as Shankar and we want to be the same. It has always been my aim to attain 100% in all of the four subjects viz., Knowledge, Yoga, Inculcation of divine Virtues and Spiritual service of mankind. By maintaining a balance of all the four subjects, we can become self-sovereign. I have to make my stage stable – all the four legs of a table should be stable and equal.

At the Confluence Age, our self-respect plays a very important role. The power of one's yoga, when it is connected with Baba, makes Godly Service happen. This is how service has taken place throughout the world. With Him there is no feeling of being isolated or lonely. He is the Truth. I have to keep myself connected to Him and everything then becomes right. By keeping the self focused on God and acting upon His advice, the intellect will become clean and pure. *Q. How will people realize* that we are unique in the world? How are the sisters here different from women in the world?

Many people are inspired by the divine knowledge. In the world women want money, position and recognition but we are different. We are Brahma Kumars and Brahma Kumaris. People are recognizing the work we are doing. If there is no cleanliness, the truth will not be visible. If we are civilized and simple, people notice that. People see that we don't waste anything.

Depression will never come if we have good company and keep attention on study. We must also perform spiritual service. We have to give to



others what we have received. *Q. How can we remain ever happy*?

The first requirement for being ever happy is to keep good company. Don't harbour negative feelings for anyone. Keep the Comforter of Hearts, i.e. Dilaram Baba in your heart. When can we win God's heart? First, we should be accurate in our life. We need to maintain purity of our inner self. Mundane, ordinary and egotistical thoughts decrease our purity. Some have ego of their spiritual efforts or of their physical attributes, talents, skills etc. In such a mental stage, one's mind stays away from truth. When truth is there, the soul gets patience. Through patience, humility comes. Humility is very important. When there is humility, there is sweetness. If patience is missing, what will happen to your purity, to your sweetness?

I wish all souls to have the feeling of belonging, but not of attachment. The feeling of belonging keeps one safe. It

increases spirituality.... One doesn't need to make anything an excuse to go off in doubt. Each one has amazing specialties. We should not waste time in talking about people. We need to use our thoughts or energy in a worthwhile way and in that way it gets accumulated.

Souls should now receive light from far and they should become my companions in the divine task. If we are completely faithful and trustworthy, Baba gives the highest return. I now just have to be a renunciate; be simple and a sample. Brahma Baba's penance (tapasya) was the foundation of Foreign Service. When I am free from worry, only then Baba can get His work done through me.

Q. How can I overcome bodyconsciousness and inspire others also to do so?

We are inculcating the knowledge of the Supreme Soul. One who has yoga over a long time will reach Baba at the end ... When one maintains a good yoga stage – a clear connection with Baba, then it is not a big deal for him to experience a bodiless stage. Let us discard all waste thoughts and remain busy in serving mankind. Our stage of Godly remembrance provides immense inspiration to others and helps them to experience soul-consciousness-beyond all mundane attachments.

Praveen and Suresh are close friends. As Praveen has returned from an outstation visit, they plan to meet in a nearby park at 5 p.m.

When they meet, they have the following conversation: **Suresh:** "I just joined driving class today. I started the

engine and you know I was so scared. I felt nervous". Praveen(listening patiently):

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Suresh: "What I believe is that a lot of confidence is required to drive on the roads, which I feel to be lacking in me. I am just thinking whether to discontinue driving class."

Praveen: "Listen friend, don't be disheartened so easily. Just get on. Continue for just three days more".

Suresh: "Do you think all had a lot of confidence while they started driving?"

Praveen: "Probably not".

Suresh (persuading further): "Then how did they learn the driving?".

Praveen: "They might have had some amount of confidence initially and probably as they practised, they developed more confidence."

Suresh: "Does it mean that it is okay to start only if we have

some self-confidence and then during practice, more confidence can be built."

Praveen: "Yes, you have got the point, but there is a word of caution by wise people".

Suresh (with keen interest): "what is that?"

Praveen: "It will increase one's self-confidence, which is good. But, beyond certain point, it may harm."

Suresh: "Does it also mean that there is the optimum level of confidence?"

Praveen (smilingly): "Yes, lack of confidence creates harmful effects like depression, loneliness, anxiety, etc. whereas over-confidence creates arrogance, anger, feeling of supremacy, etc. But it is better to play in the bandwidth of confidence, which will ensure success. And interestingly, everyone has a different bandwidth".

Suresh: I understand it now. Neither under-confidence nor over-confidence is good. Optimum confidence ensures success, which is also termed as self-confidence.

here was once a powerful king named Hiranyakashipu, who did a lot of penance and meditation and lived a very pious and virtuous life. God was very pleased with him for setting such a good example for others to follow. God offered to grant the king whatever blessings, wishes or boons he desired. The king requested for a boon that "he should die neither during the day nor night, neither inside nor outside a house, he should be killed neither by any human being nor be destroyed by any beast, nor be annihilated by metallic or wooden weapons". The boon was granted to him for exemplary his glorification of and faith in God.

Absolute Power Corrupts Absolutely

After the boon was granted to him, the king was so confident of the security of sovereignty that his love for worship decreased, while his greed for power increased which changed his humility into arrogance. The king thought that since the boon had made him invincible and invulnerable, he could rule forever and assume the role of God. The king, overcome by the lust for absolute power, decreed that everyone in the kingdom should praise and worship him as God. The subjects fearfully obeyed the king's orders. The king had the thought that after a few generations, most people would forget about the existence of true God. His clever plans came to pass and eventually he himself forgot God and did. howsoever immoral, what pleased him.

Prahlad—witness to a miracle

The king had a son named Prahlad. Prahlad was passing through the city one day and saw a potter praying to Vishnu whom the potter referred to as God. The potter had inadvertently lit the furnace to bake his pots when he realized that a litter of kittens was in one of the pots. He felt that it was too late to save the kittens. In tearful prayer, he was crying out to Lord Vishnu to save the kittens as he believed only Lord had the power to perform such an act of charity or miracle. When Prahlad heard this, he said to the potter, "but you should pray to my father, the king, who is God".

Prahlad's Realization of God

The potter then suggested to Prahlad that he would worship the king if he, the king, can save the kittens. Prahlad was taken aback and became confused as to whether the king was really God. The statement of the potter worried him all night and Prahlad returned to the potter's home to satisfy his curiosity early next morning. When the furnace was eventually opened, the potter as well as Prahlad found that the fire had not reached that particular part of the furnace and the kittens were alive and safe. Prahlad was amazed to observe this miracle and he immediately had the realization that his father was not God, but an imposter and fake. Prahlad then openly defied his father's decree to be

worshipped as God.

Prahlad, a Child of God, shows his divinity

Prahlad began worshiping God Vishnu to the great annoyance of his father. The king realized that his son's determination could undermine and erode his absolute power. The king ordered capital punishment for his son as a deterrent to the people to see what could happen if they did not worship him. The king tried to get his son Prahlad killed by throwing him down from a hill, but as providence would intervene, Prahlad was saved. Prahlad was then made to sit into a fire but instead, the King's sister Holika was burnt to ashes. Next he was put before a lion, but the lion bowed playfully and played with Prahlad and would not harm him.

Greed for Power kills a **Father's Conscience**

Finally, the king thought that his instructions to kill Prahlad were not carried out by his officers because they all loved him. So he decided to kill Prahlad himself to demonstrate to the entire kingdom what could befall them if they blindly followed Prahlad. The king had a huge

city gate constructed with iron spikes at the top. Huge hollow iron pillars were heated to glowing red hot temperatures. The king instructed Prahlad to embrace the fiery pillars if he had so much faith that Lord Vishnu would save him. Prahlad was determined and really had the faith that God would intervene and save him from this cruelty. His father, the king, bellowed in arrogance and dared Prahlad to embrace the red-hot pillars.

Prahalad's Unshakable Faith in God

Prahlad with firm belief in God, thought that this was his moment of faith and that God would intervene. Prahlad saw an ant moving on the pillar and thought; if an ant could move on the hot pillar, so could he. He embraced the hot pillar and the pillar cracked open to reveal a living creature of half man and half lion. The creature had the head and feet of a lion and the body of a man. The king was overpowered as the creature clawed into the king's body killing the king by hurling him into the air where he fell on the spikes of the huge Iron Gate.

Flaws in the Boon

The big question is: how could God kill the king, whom He Himself had given an invincible boon? God never reneges on his blessings or boons. The answer to this is in the revelation of God as one who is beyond birth and death and this is the sovereign secret of the Gita and in particular c4v1-9.

Revelations of the Boon

Let us now examine the boon of the king and how he was killed. The king asked for a boon that "he should never be killed either during the day or night, or by anyone born of woman, or by an animal or beast, or by metallic or wooden weapons as well as inside or outside a house.

1st Boon – Neither in the Day nor during the Night

The period between the Iron-Age and Golden Age is called the Auspicious Confluence Age referred to in the Gita as **Purushottam** Sangam Yug, when God descends, as stated in Gita c4v7. The Golden Age and the Silver Age are called the 'day of Brahma'. The Copper Age and the Iron Age are called the 'night of Brahma'. This period of 100 years between the Iron Age and the Golden Age, is called the

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Confluence Age. This period of 'dawn or era of transformation' is considered neither day nor night. This is when God Shiva descends to destroy the darkness of ignorance or the evils of the world at Sangam Yug or the Confluence Age. This descent of God Shiva is called "Shivratri"—ratri signifying the Dark Age or the period of unrighteousness, irreligiousness or lawlessness. When God descends. He protects the virtuous souls who become the instruments of God. Such instruments of God are symbolized by Prahlad. 'The boon of neither day nor night' points to the 'dawn' or the 'era of transformation'.

2nd Boon – Not by anyone born of human-beings

The Gita c4vs7-8 says that when there is unrighteousness and lawlessness in the world, God would descend to protect the virtuous, destroy the evil and to re-establish *dharma*. God himself says that He is '*abhogta*'.

God is immune to Birth and Death

The Gita is very explicit that God is not subject to the

cycle of birth and rebirth. God is 'abhogta' means that He is above the bondage of karma, nature and matter. Therefore. if God is 'abhogta', He surely does not have a mother or father. In the Gita c9v11, God tells Arjuna, "Fools, not knowing my supreme nature, think low of Me, the Lord of creation who has put on the human body. That is, they take me, who has appeared in human garb through my Yogamaya (divine potency) for the deliverance of the world, to be an ordinary mortal".

God continues to advise in the Gita c10 v3, "He who knows me in reality as without birth and without beginning, and as the supreme Lord of the universe, he, un-deluded among men, is purged of all the sins". The Gita continues to point out to the devotees that God is never in human form, quote the Gita c7v24, "Not knowing My unsurpassable and un-decaying supreme nature, the unintelligent think Me, the Supreme Spirit beyond the reach of mind and senses, the embodiment of Truth, Knowledge and Bliss, to have assumed a visible human form".

C7V25 continues to expound on God's form: "Veiled by My

Yogamaya, I am not manifest to all. Hence these ignorant folk do not recognize Me as the unborn and imperishable Supreme Spirit, that is, take Me to be subject to birth and death". Therefore, all the epithets in the Gita that refer to Krishna are but the divine attributes of God Shiva who is the only One who can liberate mankind when trapped in the chains of Ravana.

3rd Boon–Not by Animal or by Beast

The creature was described as "half man and half lion" and was named "Narsingh". The creature cannot fit in the category of either man or that of animal or beast. Narsingh, when spiritually interpreted means "the lion of mankind" which is a title symbolic of God alone.

4th Boon–Not inside or outside the House

The Iron Gate was constructed so that it might separate the inside from the outside of the palace. The king died on the spikes that pierced his body and holding in place on top of the gate. It was neither inside nor outside. Symbolically, this also describes the Confluence Age or the

"dawn" of transformation.

5th Boon – Neither by metallic nor by **Wooden Weapons**

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The claws of the creature are not considered as metallic or wooden. The claws here represent the weapon of 'gyan and yoga', the teachings of the Gita. Recall how Rama killed Ravan with the 'Brahma Astra' when all other weapons simply made Ravan unconscious and could not destroy him. The 'Brahma Astra' is not a bow and arrow, but it is symbolic of the weapon of Gyan and Yoga. Recall the 'Sanjeevani Booti,' the herb, that Hanuman brought from the mountain to cure Lakshman. This herb is but the 'herb of knowledge' which can conquer the forces of anger, greed, ego, lust and attachment represented by Ravan. This is why the Gita is considered the 'Mother of all Scriptures'.

Prahlad means 'Child of God'

The secret of this story is that the name 'Prahlad' is the shortened version of 'Prabhu Ki Aulad' that means 'the child of God'. The kittens in the oven represent God's faithful and virtuous children who will be protected from the raging fire of the oven, symbolic of the 'evil heat', caused by the vices of anger, greed, ego, lust and attachment, the characteristics of king Hiranyakashipu.

The story of Prahlad is symbolic of the Iron Age when the greedy and evil rulers high-jack the world and its resources. They create chaos in religion, language, law, power and people, destroying evidence of the truth, and create mass confusion. This is why the scriptures say that in the end, false prophets would be honoured. It is only God who can save this world and this is the significance of Holi and Shivratri. The brorfire of Holika is symbolic of the burning of the old, vicious things of this corrupt and promiscuous world. Only God can fit the description of the One who possesses the divine power to destroy the vicious and malicious boon.

CHRISTIANS CAN BE PROUD OF BRAHMA KUMARIS!

Being a voracious reader of the Bible, I was fascinated by the electrifying personality of Jesus Christ. Yet I often wondered whether such an elevated personality was really possible? Can we find today a community of people as a whole practising what Jesus taught with his life?

Let us do an interesting exercise. We will make a chart of major things Jesus said and did, and replace his name with the pronoun he, and ask the world: "Whose characteristics are they?

Here is the chart:

He led a life of remembrance of God. "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark," He used to go to a lonely place so as to talk to his heavenly Father, as if engaging in a nectar-time (*Amritavela*) meditation daily. (Mark 1:35; John 8:1, 2). Then again during the day, evening, and sometimes even in night, he took time to talk to his Heavenly Father.—Luke 5:16; 6:12; Mathew 14:23.

- His life itself was a meditation, as if always doing, in principle, an open-eved meditation, as he kept his 'eyes single.' (Mathew 6:22) He had the real eyes that saw the eternal behind the ephemeral, or the SOURCE behind the resources. (Luke 11:27, 28; 18:18-19)
- He practised celibacy; because he viewed all women as his own sisters. (Mathew 23:9) Hence, He never looked at a woman lustfully. (Mathew 5:28)
- He had a great mind (Brahma, in Sanskrit) treating God as his Father and others as his brothers and sisters. (Mathew 23:9) Because of this, he was never influenced by his

fleshly family members and relatives. (Mathew 12:46-50) He was like a bride towards God who is also called 'husband' (Isaiah 54:5) and doing God's will was like intoxication to him. (John 4:34; 6:38)

- He declared goodness or beneficence (*Shivam* in Sanskrit) as the primary and exclusive attribute of our heavenly Father; and He is the source of all good gifts. (Mark 10:18; Mathew 7:11)
- He knew he was a soul, had existed before in Heaven. and would return to heaven after earthly life. (John 5:24; 6:38, 62; 8:42; 13:1; 17:5) He taught that our Heavenly Father is "spirit," or incorporeal. Thus he implied all His children are also spiritual beings acting in physical bodies; hence are the exact representation of His very being. (John 4:24; 6:63 Compare Ecclesiastes 12:7 and Mark 12:26-27) He also taught we can choose to be peaceful and pure souls, and become the children of God. (Mathew 5:3, 8,9) Hence he could ask us: "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

(Mathew 5:48)

- Every soul carries within it a sanskar (unique personality traits) of one's own making and acts accordingly. (Mathew 12:35)
- He believed every action (even an unproductive word one utters) has equal and opposite reaction. (Mathew 12:36; 23:12; Luke 6:38)
- He taught that many will not change their sanskar, hence will repeat their acts in their next birth too.—Luke 16:31 Compare Mathew 11:14; 12:32.
- He declared vices such as lust, anger, greed, attachment, pride ... as originating from bodyconsciousness, and showed perfect control over them.—Mark 7:21-23; compare Galatians 5:19-21; John 16:33; 1 John 2:15-17.
- Purpose of life is to become like our Heavenly Father, manifesting His qualities in day-to-day life. What is required is only a change in attitude. (Mathew 5:44-48; Genesis 11:6) This is possible because, Spirit is more powerful than the body.—John 6:63
- ▶ This Dark Age will be

replaced by Golden Age. (Mathew 12:32; Mathew 19:28) Only those who are leading a Golden Aged life now will inherit Golden Age. (Mathew 13:24-30) As the time passes by, Golden Age will steadily decline in quality and old habits will resurface (Mathew 13:33, 52) and cycle will repeat. (Ecclesiastes 1:9, 10; 3:15)

- He knew the world will come to its destruction with the stock-piles of deadly arms man has manufactured. (Mathew 24:21; 26:52)
- He taught that people will be judged on the basis of whether they have loved Light that has come into the world or not.(John 3:19-21)
- He stated that men and women are "images of God," hence equal. He chose to reveal the most important spiritual truths to a woman who was from a "low" caste community called Samaritans. (John 4) He declared that projection of woman as inferior was result the of "hardheartedness" of some ancient men, which obviously has nothing to do with Scriptures. (Mathew

19:4-8) God is not partial to any nation or religion; but goes by fruitage one produces (Mathew 21:43)

• When all the men whom Jesus personally trained deserted him, "many women" stood with him at the direst moments of his life, ministering to him. (Mathew 27:55) He praised women as having keener insight into future and spirituality than men 26:10-13 (Mathew Contrast John 6:60) and appointed women to impart vital spiritual truth to men. (John 20:16-18)

In brief, he lived up to his name, Jesus, (transliteration of the Hebrew Jehoshua), which means "Jehovah is salvation." Jehovah means "I am that I am." (Exodus 3:14) Abraham very well knew the meaning of this name and had already put the essence of it in a simple title as "the eternal" (`Olam, in Hebrew) in Genesis 21:33, which God Himself expanded later as: "I am the Alpha and the Omega ... who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty." (Revelation 1:8) What better word can convey God's name as the eternal (as opposed to the ephemeralthings that appear, remain for some time and disappear after

a while)? He is THE SOURCE behind all the resources; hence only HE can become our saviour, the supreme beneficent; and only He can become the valid object of our love. (James 1:17) Thus, Jesus' name was a roaring reminder to the world: "Remember God, because He only is your Saviour," which is in essence all the teachings of Brahama Kumaris put together. "Remember God and be pure" has been their most important mantra from their very inception!

Now ask the world, whom the above mentioned things identify. "That is what Brahma Kumaris do," people with keen insight will answer. Similarity between Brahma Kumaris and Jesus is not a coincidence. The basis of God's children is always the same, it never changes. (Mathew 5:44-48) Hence Christians can actually be proud of Brahma Kumaris who collectively prove Jesus is practical, and who remain pure and help the world as light-bearers in this "time of the end." - Compare Mathew 24:3; 25:1-13

can make them feel empowered if they don't work on themselves. If they start working slowly on empowering themselves, it will create a feeling of fulfilment among them. It will raise their self-confidence and self-esteem.

Although as an individual one woman alone cannot change the government, the society or the education system, she can still become an instrument for bringing about a change in the society in her small way. I know many of my sisters who despite all odds against them refused to succumb to the pain and suffering they were subjected to. They instantly were looked upon as a role model and changed the way we look at women. Women have to make their own efforts, if they want permanent relief from the atrocities they are subjected to; something which enables them to enjoy freedom, by cutting their chains. They will have to stop

blaming government, their parents, the society or siblings for their plight and work on a daily basis to awaken their own powers that are lying within themselves. Being 'empowered' is not about begging for their rights or the freedom to go out in 'short skirts' or be draped in 'burgas'. It is about feeling free from inside. In the process of spiritual progress, there are three stages which one has to pass through:-

- *Bhakti* (Devotion)
- Gyan (Wisdom/Knowledge)
- Vairagya (Detachment).

As revealed to us by Incorporeal God Shiva through Prajapita Brahma, the Time Cycle of one Kalpa (5000 yrs.), comprises four main ages i.e., Satyuga, Tretayuga, Dwaparayuga and Kaliyuga. During the first two ages, called Golden Age and Silver Age respectively, all human beings are virtuous deities. There is only one religion, called 'Aadi Sanatan Devi Devta Dharma'. There is complete purity, peace and plenty. People do not have any desires or wants, because everything needed in their lives, is naturally available in abundance. Desire is the root cause of the loss of divine virtues in man and subsequently for the downfall of the human society.

As the people in the first two

ages live their lives in utter peace and bliss, they do not have the need to remember God or worship Him. They do not require any wisdom or gyan. They are all soulconscious and not bodyconscious. This period of complete Happiness, Bliss and Peace is the first half of the Kalpa.

The second half of the Kalpa consists of Dwaparayuga and Kaliyuga, called Copper Age and Iron Age respectively. The above mentioned three stages of spirituality are applicable to mankind, in the real sense, only during this second half of the Kalpa which is full of sorrow and disquiet. As man became body-conscious, he totally forgot the truth that he is a soul and not a physical body. He identified himself with the name, given to his body by his parents. He developed attachment to all those persons and possessions that belonged to him. To overcome uncertainties of future. he started accumulating wealth and hoarding materials. Then he thought of safe-guarding his possessions. Slowly he developed a group of people, whom he believed to be faithful to him, to protect him and his property from unforeseen situations.

As man became more powerful and grew more selfish, he stopped bothering for the welfare of others. Soon various factions and groups were created on the earth. Every leader of the group claimed certain territory under his command and started dictating terms to others in that area. Persons opposing him were dealt with very severely. This situation led to rivalry and caused frequent fights and wars among different groups. Many a time, it caused warfare on a large scale. Thus, the whole earth got divided into different nations and various kingdoms, so much so that boundaries were demarcated in skies and seas also to indicate their sovereignty. Peaceful living got vanished from the world.

During this period of crisis, certain great souls arrived in this World to guide the Mankind on the path of righteousness. Abraham, Gautam Buddha, Jesus Christ etc. gave the message of unity and universal brotherhood. Adi Shankaracharya initiated

the path of *Sanyas*. Many other holy souls followed. All of the holy souls preached:-

- The Supreme Father or God is one.
- We are Immortal Souls, not the physical bodies.
- We are the Children of that One Supreme Father and so we are all brothers.
- We must love all and hate none, and so on.

But the mankind missed to understand their message and the decline of Dharma continued unabatedly. His looks and words are soothing and they bring solace to the suffering mankind. He is ever introverted and silently contemplates the **Supreme** Father. Such spiritual aspirant is really loved by God and indeed a great inspiration for the fellow beings.

BIRTHDAY OF THE SERMONISER OF THE GITA

hen God Shiva descends at the confluence of *Kaliyuga* and *Satyuga*, or *Sangam yuga*, He bestows the knowledge to us souls that Time moves in a **cyclic pattern** and that all the four ages (Satyuga, Treta, Dwapar, and Kaliyuga) get repeated every cycle or *Kalpa*. A *Kalpa* is of 5000 years duration.

The 100 year period between the end of Kaliyuga and the beginning of Satyuga is called the Confluence Age. It is the most auspicious age because God descends on earth at that time. In fact, it is the most elevated age because man becomes elevated.

When God Shiva comes, He sermonises Gita, and establishes the **Original Eternal Deity Religion** (*Adi Sanatan Devi- Devata* Dharma). This is the religion that gets continued in Satyuga and Tretayuga. God's descent and incarnation on earth is known as Shivratri or Shiv Jayanti. Since He sermonises the Gita, it is also the birth of the Gita.

Not only Hindus, but Jews, Christians and Muslims also believe in the Incorporeal God. There are Shiva temples in every nook and corner of India. The ancient names of God such as 'Shuin' in Babylon, 'Seva' or 'Sevajya' in Syria, Egypt and Fiji; 'Sibru' in the land occupied by the progeny of Abraham and Jehovah, are not too different from the Sanskrit word 'Shiva', which, according to some scholars, is the confluence of two phonetic parts, 'shi' and 'va', meaning redeemer and liberator from sins and

India has increased in substantially and women are now playing crucial roles in all fields, they still have not been given their due status and have not been allowed to enjoy equal rights. Often, men don't seek or listen to women's advice, and neglect them. Many males consider females merely as goods and objects of sex-gratification or playthings and keep them under subjugation and in veil, or confined within the four walls of the house.

In India, about 49% of the society is constituted of women. But if women are exploited and are not given a proper place in society, how can we have a peaceful and harmonious society? Not only are women considered as second-grade citizens in many communities and families, but are also insulted and treated as bonded labourers and slaves. They are looked upon as consumer goods and are treated as machines of childproduction. For many centuries, the daughter has been considered inferior to the son and has been treated even as a monetary burden on the family.

The role of women in the family has never been appreciated appropriately by society. The womenfolk rear

and bring up the child, look after the family with dedication and sincerity, as a daughter, a sister, a wife or a mother. They serve the society in the true sense and contribute significantly to its wholesome and harmonious development. Let us ponder: Can there be a human society without women or without their roles? ew people say that life is all about living it to the fullest. Some say life is to enjoy; others think that a human existence is an impossible thing even for gods. Thus, live the life in a manner that you attain the goal of life and make your life a success. Watching a sad person makes us sad and by watching a lively face we feel relieved of our tensions; all our fatigue vanishes. Life is one but there are different ways of living it. But picture this..... A face that reminds you of God, seeing which you overcome anxiety, stress, tension etc. and experience the waves of peace and calm; how wonderful!

I am going to introduce you to such a life. In April 2013, I visited Mt. Abu for participating in a spiritual congregation. We were informed that the next day, girl students of Shakti Niketan Hostel would showcase a presentation at Diamond Hall. Apart from the other presentations, around 6-7 girls showed stunts and gymnastics.

It was an awesome feat – the way girls the were performing, the balance, the unparalleled courage and enthusiasm were incredible. Dadi Janki, the main (elder) teacher applauded them. I had seen such feats and amazing stunts in the circus only and wondered: who teaches these girls? To appease my curiosity, I visited these sweet little girls at their hostel -Shakti Niketan at Indore.

When I reached Indore, I realized that this is the city which is known as the city of Mother Ahilya, an ardent devotee of Lord Shiva. Naturally in such a holy city only spiritual and God like powers would prevail. Basking in the glory of the beautiful morning, I reached Palasia, a posh area of the city where the office of Brahma Kumaris' Indore Zone is situated.

There, I was taken on a tour of the facilities – the drawing room, the dining hall, kitchen, computer room, office, the granary, big meditation hall, library, the girls' bedrooms with their double storied beds, a big roof top with solar system for hot water and the dough preparing machine. The infrastructure is incredible.

I was very keen to meet the fabulous girls because of whom I was attracted to this place and as if on cue the sister introduced me to these angels.

There are about 150 girls in the hostel. In addition to academic knowledge, they also gain spiritual knowledge. Simplicity, piety and austerity are their ornaments; by following these traits they gain saintly qualities. From the length and breadth of our country, right from Kashmir to Kanya Kumari, the girls get admitted to this hostel, according to their capability and the rules and regulations. Many sisters, who have been trained in this hostel, have

been extending their services for the moral and spiritual rejuvenation of the world.

After gathering the relevant information, I met the bright girls; their simplicity, straightforwardness, humility and affection attracted me automatically. By looking at them, we are reminded of the Divine Existence.

I am now recapitulating my conversation with the girls:

Q. How do you feel here? A. We like it a lot.

Q. Don't you miss your families, your homes?

A. If one has attachment with one's family, physical separation from it makes one sad. 
Blessed are the parents whose children are being raised here. Salutations to the Brahma Kumaris!

A tribute: **RAJAYOGINI DADI CHANDRAMANI**

Dadi Chandramani was one of the prime jewels of Brahma Kumaris (the erstwhile Om Mandali) since its inception. She played very important role in spreading Godly services, particularly in Punjab Zone. Due to her fearlessness, she was called the Lioness of Punjab. **B.K. Surendran** from Bangalore shares his spiritual experiences with Dadi Chandermani.



adi Chandramani's childhood name was Mothil and she was a multifaceted personality. She had studied up to 10th standard. Though her family was not directly related to Brahma Baba's family, one of her lokik sisters got married in the Kripalani family and, thus, she was related to Brahma Baba. However, before coming to gyan, she had not met Brahma Baba. Since her childhood, she had special interest in yoga. She used to read scriptures on Sikhism. Those days, it was a routine practice to sing the prayer: 'Oh Lord, you are our father and mother and we are children". your She

remembered God as father and mother. She had seven sisters and one brother who passed away then. The husband of her sister also passed away. Therefore. there was sorrowful atmosphere at home. One sister and her daughter used to visit their house to give them solace during those sorrowful days. They told her about the satsang of Baba. Then Baba was not staying in his own house, but in the house of his uncle (Father's younger brother) named Moolchand Ajwalla, where Baba was staying in a small room. When she went to see Baba, she saw that one sister there was lost in trance and was telling about Satyug such as aeroplanes etc., instantly and Dadi Chandramani also went in trance. She experienced that she got detached from the body. She did not know how long she remained in the state of trance. When she opened her eyes, she saw nobody there.

Subsequently, she accepted

Baba as her mother, father and everything. She felt a close feeling of belongingness with Brahma Baba. She shared that at that time, they did not have the knowledge that Shiv Baba descended onto the body of Brahma Baba. But, they felt a kind of magnetic pull towards Brahma Baba. His subtle stage and spiritual power attracted them. Brahma Baba did not have a worldly way of dealing even with his wife, daughter, daughter-in-law or other relations. Baba's lokik house didn't look like a householder's residence but like a godly family.

Her five generations came to *gyan*.

One day Dadi shared with Baba about the sorrowful atmosphere at her home. Then Baba himself visited their house and met her parents. Baba told her mother that if she came to the *satsang*, she would get a child like Sri Krishna. Then immediately her mother felt as if Sri Krishna was in her lap and became very happy. Seeing

this, Dadi Chandermani's father also started coming to *satsang*. He gave up eating non-vegetarian food and drinking. Subsequently, many of her relatives came to *gyan*. In fact, there are five generations from her family who have been in *gyan*. Some are dedicated and others are leading a lotus like life while being in household.

Yagya life and Spiritual Endeavours

Those days, there were around 400 brothers and sisters staying with Brahma Baba. There was very heavy workload in the ashram. Brothers were very few in number and many tasks, which were traditionally performed by brothers, had to be handled by sisters. Baba would say that what work was being done was not important, but with what mental state that work was being performed, was important. That is why they used to do all types of work together with love and harmony. When Baba would pronounce the sound of 'Om', all of them would go in the state of trance. Baba used to call them as 'Om' Mothi, 'Om' Radhe, 'Om Rama', to remind them that they were souls. Baba's house was known as 'Jasoda Nivas' which was converted into 'Om Mandali'.

Once. Dadi asked Baba whether she should give up further studies but Baba advised her to continue her studies. After six months, Baba opened a school for children and she was selected as English Teacher. As its principal, Brahma Baba used to visit different classes and taught different subjects. At the end of the day, he would ask for a daily report of the activities. He would advise the teachers not to scold the children but teach them with love and care. Baba was very particular about the children's mental and physical development. Observing her calmness and simplicity, BapDada gave her the spiritual name 'Chandramani.

Dadi Chandermani used to visit Bangalore frequently for conducting special congregations like Bhatti etc., and also public service programmes because Dadi Hridyapushpa, who was her *lokik* elder sister, had become instrumental in starting the Godly Services in Southern India and she was the Zonal Incharge of Karnataka, with her headquarters in Bangalore. After Dadi Hridyapushpa left her mortal coil in 1995. Dadi Chandramani was entrusted with additional the responsibility to administer the

affairs of Karnataka Zone also. Her achievements in Godly Service

After recognising God's divine task and the spiritual teachings, she followed Shrimat strictly and upheld the divine code of conduct. She became instrumental in spreading spiritual services in northern India particularly in Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Sikkim and many other places in India. Due to her courage and fearless nature, she used to be deputed to solve problems in Godly Service, and she tackled the challenging situations with ease and poise. She was rightly given the title 'the Lioness of Punjab' by BapDada. She had absolute faith in BapDada and His mission to establish deity sovereignty. She led a simple life and was not interested in publicity, name and fame. Anyone could meet her without any formality. She was a keen student of Godly knowledge and Rajyoga. She spoke of God's versions and also gave lectures with deep conviction and determination which had unparalleled impact on the listeners.

Dadi Chandramani sustained Godly students with great care. She ascended to BapDada's lap on 11th March, 1997 when she (..contd. on page no. 33)



NEUROGENETICS, NCDs AND DISEASELESSNESS

he stress in life today is truly omnipresent and omnipotent. Tensions, unhappiness, worries and frustrations in Mind give rise to a group of diseases called **Stress Associated Diseases or** SADs. Sadness is natural due to expensive treatments and difficult doctors. The current term for SADs is NCDs or Non-infectious Chronic Diseases. This category is incurable by modern medicine. Tablets, capsules and even the pessaries become a staple diet for the unfortunate person. Quality Of Life (QOL) comes to the lowest nadir. Many wish for euthanasia. An independent department in Maharashtra Health Services has been set up to deal with the problem of NCDs. Many today suffer from Chronic Fatigue Syndrome (CFS) because people do not have quality sleep and suffer from a sleep backlog. Fast brain with very fast thoughts rapidly exhausts the Godgiven quota of neurotrans-

mitters. Suicides happen because of the sudden drop in the level of neurotransmitters.

Two latest branches of Medicine - Psycho-neuroendocrino-immunology(PNI) and Psycho-Oncology are investigating why NCDs like Hypertension, Hyperacidity, Heart attacks, Diabetes, Alzheimer's, Dementia, asthma, insomnia, obesity, addictions, cancer and several others have become incurable. This new medical science is called as Mind-Body Medicine. Disease-centric strategies like cardio-centric, Diabeto-centric, Condomcentric and Obesity-centric are giving a medical paradox of alarming rise in the incidence of the diseases against which they are directed. Every third Indian today has twin diseases - Diabetes and High Blood pressure. Obesity has become a global epidemic. Depression is affecting even the school going children. Even the young doctors are dying of

heart attacks. Sex-crimes, mindless violence and Rage syndrome have increased alarmingly. Abnormal greed has given rise to Scam after Scam Syndrome (SASS). There is a collapse of all the dimensions of Total Health– physical, mental, social, emotional and spiritual.

The main reason for this is having unlimited wants. But a Mind-centric Strategy is conspicuous by its absence. Hippocrates, Father of Modern Medicine, many years ago, had cautioned: The greatest error today is that the physicians do not take the soul into account for therapy. The doctors are committing the same mistake today. They are neglecting the mind, the third component of the soul. The reason for this error is the training in Western concepts of Medicine which wholly focuses on the matters of the body. Sheldon described three morphotypes-Ecto, Meso and Endomorph and their relationship with the

diseases. On the other hand, 1000-year-old Charak Sanhita classifies personality into 15 types according to the type of Consciousness, each one requiring different therapeutic strategy involving Herbs, metals and **meditation**. Today Charak Sanhita is considered as a treatise on "Whole Person Medicine."

Three main levels of consciousness are Satvik. Rajasik and Tamasik. Ontological (Satvik) denotes a peaceful, loveful, blissful, pure and the most powerful personality. Highest category in Ontological personality is known as Brahma type which is ever youthful and almost disease-less. Rajasik personality pursues the Path of Preyas and wastes his Lifeforce [Prana] in the pursuit of sensual pleasures, temptations and materialistic gains and soon becomes a prey to diseases and premature ageing. Tamasik personality is full of sloth, laziness and devoted solely to the pleasures of food and sex.

Charak further describes five body-sheaths that surround the innermost *Atman* or Soul. *Annamaya kosh* is the superficial-most layer. All of the drugs in Modern Medicine act only up to Annamaya Kosh. Thus, the root cause of the disease is never addressed. No wonder there is resurgence or recurrence. Pranayam removes the impurities from the Pranamay kosh and gives a miraculous cure of asthma and allergies. The free radicals which are formed due to stress and are responsible for oxidative damage, are possibly removed by Pranayam. Meditation removes the impurities in Manamay Kosh (Mind). Negative thoughts and toxic emotions (Daniel Goleman) are these impurities. Scriptures describe them as Desires, Negative thoughts and powerful chain of derogatory thoughts. Today, Patanjali's Dhyan became baptized as Mindful Meditation by Dr. Richard Davidson, Professor of Psychiatry, U.S.A. It is now considered as the most powerful technique for Mindempowerment and Mindcontrol. Mindful meditation stabilizes the Mind in powerful and pure Satvik (ontological) consciousness. Such mindset is not motivated by Self-interest. It adheres to values like honesty, sincerity, integrity and positive emotions like love, hope and happiness under most adverse circumstances. Stabilization in ontological consciousness gives a Spiritual equipoise (*Sthit-pragnya* state).

Neuroscience has proved that a positive state of mind has a great role in maintaining health and in prevention and cure of NCDS or Modern Lifestyle diseases. Russian experiments with thoughtpower opened an entirely new frontier in modern medicine. The concept of thought is the instrument for healing. A positive mind transmits powerful and pious thoughtvibrations and creates a white, bright and well-demarcated body-aura around the person. This is similar to the halo shown around our deities. Hypnosis or mesmerizing the other persons is possible for such a thought-empowered individual. The positive thought-vibrations purify the atmosphere and also give activation of Ultraclean rhythms of the body releasing very powerful rejuvenating hormones. Encephalin gives a 'Cholesterol-wash' to the heart vessels by 'Reverse, transport of Cholesterol'. Intractable lipid and sugar levels are restored to normal. Endorphin is a natural and very powerful

mood-elevator and pain-killer. The miracle of Ramana Maharshi undergoing a surgical procedure without anaesthesia may be due to this neuro-hormone. Melatonin gives sound and recharging sleep. Brain-derived-Neurotrophic Factor (BDNF) enhances memory by giving multiplication of brain cells. No wonder people called Ekpathy could remember Vedas after hearing them just once. A kriya-yogi could possibly retain his wit, vitality, vision and vigour till last breath as told by the sage Patanjali. A recent concept-Stem Cell Activation Factor (SCAF) released during meditation shall mean recreating any damaged organ without transplant or expensive stem cell implantation. All of these neuro-hormones are powerful activators for the Natural Killer cells which destroy the cancer cells no sooner they are formed in the body. This may be the reason for doubling of the life-span of the cancer patients and for several of them becoming cancer-free in Carl Simonton's Psycho-Oncology Institute, USA by a Mindfulness Meditation Programme. Allen's brain map reveals several Cerebral

genes or Brain-genes, which activate the harmful somatic genes [Body-genes] that give rise to the diseases like depression, Diabetes, Dementia, Alzheimer's and musculo-skeletal disorders. The neuro-hormones secreted during Mindfulness possibly inhibit the enzymes and prevent the dreadful diseases.

The effects of the atmosphere charged with positive thoughts are simply unbelievable. Dr. Hew Len's modification of Mexican Ho'oponopono and James Twyman's Global consciousness project provide evidence, which as yet, is beyond the scope of science to explain scientifically. A study published in The journal of offenders' rehabilitation reports that a group of people regularly met and meditated with the thoughts of Love and Peace for the whole world over a period of two years. This simple act reduced all acts of terrorism by phenomenal 72%. Violent crimes in Washington DC have been reduced by 23.6% in just two months' period. As soon as the meetings of the meditators stopped, the crime level started going up again. Fifty different scientific studies over preceding 30 years have

shown that the meditators created miraculous improvement in the health and the Quality Of Life (QOL). Along with the impact on health and emotions, there was a decrease in crimes, wars, violence and riots. James Twyman, who led several group synchronized prayers throughout the world through his 'Global consciousness Project' functions on the concept that the tsunamis of the world are the reflections of the tsunamis in the human minds. These studies established a plain and simple dictum for health and solutions to the calamities in the world lays in healing yourself. Selftransformation shall bring the world-transformation.

Dr. Hew Len's Hawaiian Ho'oponopono – Dr. Len a psychiatrist was made incharge of a ward where they kept criminally insane and dangerous patients. Psychiatrists quit on monthly basis. Dr. Len did an innovative act in addition to the usual therapy-his version of Hawaiian Ho'oponopono. In his chamber, he held each patient's file and kept on saying "I am sorry" and "I love you" over and over again. Within a few months, a miracle happened. The

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patients who were shackled were allowed to walk freely. Others, who had to be heavily medicated, started getting off their medication. Those who had absolutely no chance of getting released were freed. Absenteeism and the turn-over of the staff disappeared. Soon the staff outnumbered the patients and today the ward is closed.

Dr. Peter Gariaev carried out numerous experiments with thought-power. One of them is most relevant. He created Alloxan-Diabetes in rats by destroying the pancreas with this chemical. Such rats died within 4 to 6 days due to Type-1 Diabetes. Dr. Gariev then removed the pancreas from a healthy rat. Then he shined a nonburning green laser beam through the healthy pancreas on to the rats poisoned with Alloxan. Amazingly, the rats who received this novel treatment showed full recovery. They continued to live like perfectly normal rats. Three different research projects in 2001, 2002 and 2003 replicated Gariaev's findings. The green laser beam as well as our thoughts is a form of photo-electric energy. Patanjali had described that a single-point laser beam focus of positive thoughts could be created by the technique of Vruitti Nirodh (restraint of one's instincts) and one could achieve the conquest of

ageing NC diseases. The experiments of the practicants of Rajyoga meditation taught by the Brahmakumaris organisation also endorse the efficacy and importance of thoughts in healing both mind and body.

In short, beware of what kind of thoughts your mind is having and where it is visiting, because sooner or later your body shall follow Mindfulness it there. Meditation Programme as taught free of cost in Sir J.J. Hospital, Mumbai, could easily give you a disease-less state with delayed ageing. Incurable disease means whose cure lies within and the word "Healthy" actually means "Heal Thy."

MEDITATION AND HEALTH

Each original quality of the self or soul is specially required for nourishing and empowering one human body system. The quality of peace is responsible for taking care of the respiratory system, joy for the gastrointestinal system, love for the circulatory system, bliss for the endocrine system, knowledge for the brain and nervous system, purity for the immune system and the five senses and power for the muscular and skeletal systems.

Each one of us has at least one body system, which is most prone to disease. When our mind is under the influence of stressful emotions, there is a decrease in the flow, from the soul to this body system, of that quality which is required by it for its nourishment, which leads to the development of disease in this system over a period of time e.g. when an individual with a weak respiratory system is in a negative state of mind, there is a decrease in the flow of the quality of peace to the respiratory system which in turn can lead to a disorder like asthma.

IT'S TIME TO RECOGNISE GOD

n ancient times, there lived an artist in a small kingdom. He had been gifted by God with wonderful mastery in drawing pictures. The beautiful pictures made by him with wholehearted effort used to attract people's attention. One day he made a colourful picture and hung it at the public plaza, situated in the centre of the town. The picture soon got the attention of the passers-by because of its strangeness. It immediately became the centre of attraction and the talk of the town. The picture was apparently of a man, but it was unrecognizable because half of the man's head had hair which covered his face. and the other half of his head was bald. The man in the picture had long legs with wings on its feet. The spectators looked at the picture and interpreted it according to their own perception.

Nobody could surmise the hidden meaning of the picture. Gradually, the King

also came to know about the strange picture. Curious to know its hidden meaning, the king went to the Artist and asked him, "Well, you have made this picture with great sincerity and concentration; but whose picture is it? Why does one part of the head have hair and why is the other half bald? Another strange thing is the long legs with wings on its feet. I am keen to know the hidden meaning behind the picture." The Artist very humbly informed the king that the picture was of 'TIME' actually. The king couldn't believe his eyes and asked him to explain it in detail.

The Artist then explained, "Well, My lord, as far as the face is concerned, it is covered and is unrecognizable; it symbolizes the fact that human beings while away most of the time uselessly, awaiting better opportunities to come but when golden moments come and knock at his door, he fails to recognize it because

its face is hidden. That is why I have covered the face of time with its own hair. Next, My Lord, I would like to tell about the half bald head. Man fails to recognize the auspicious time from front as it's hidden; but when the auspicious time passes away, he realizes that he has missed the golden opportunity. He then tries to chase to hold the plait of time and bring it back, but in vain because no one has the power to bring time back! That's why I have shown half bald head which doesn't have plait and is beyond man's hold. Now, I would like to tell about the legs in the picture and feet with wings; when man cannot hold the plait of time, he runs after the time that has already passed. The legs of time are shown very long because time runs very fast. Seeing time running ahead, man also runs fast to stop the fast speed of time but very cleverly time skips from man's hold and flies away in split of seconds. So the feet in the picture have wings too. By the time, man realises the importance of 'TIME'; it's too late, and there is only helplessness and regret left." On listening to the explanation. the king was

flabbergasted. He applauded and rewarded the wise artist handsomely for depicting 'Time' in a realistic way.

The above story has great relevance to the present time, as it is the most auspicious time termed as 'The Confluence Age' or Sangam Yug, a period of dawn when the Supreme Soul incarnates in the corporeal form of Brahma, the father of Humanity to enlighten the souls with the Power of Divine knowledge and Easy Rajyoga. must ponder here: Has the burning of wood or dung in the bonfire of Holika finished everyone's miseries and pains and will it finish them ever? It is clear that it is not the fire of dung etc. but the fire of Godly remembrance in which our bad resolves, thoughts and words will be finished and through which we will be able to attain complete peace and prosperity in the new world or Paradise. Thus, this festival inspires us to connect our mind and intellect with the Supreme Soul God Shiva who is called the Ocean of Purity, Peace, and Prosperity. That is why Holi follows Shivratri (Shiv Jayanti), which symbolizes the very fact that God Shiva descends on this earth at the end of the world cycle and then only the human souls who connect their mind and intellect with Him, receive complete Peace, Prosperity and Purity.

The meaning of Holika

On the occasion of Holika, people roast the fur of wheat and barley. In the spiritual parlance, penance has been likened to Knowledge (Gyan) and Meditation (Yoga) – as a roasted seed cannot produce new fruit, similarly, any deed performed in knowledgeable state cannot take the form of misdeed/wrong deed. Hence, Holika also symbolizes that Supreme Soul God Shiva gives the most benevolent advice for emancipation of all souls of the world, at the end of Kaliyuga. That advice is to roast the seed of Karma in the fire of Knowledge and Remembrance. All of us must follow this advice and we shouldn't consider Holi merely as the burning of some woods and dung, but a reminder to burn the old and polluted resolves in the fire of yoga and perform karmas in the state of soul-consciousness (vogyukt).

In other words, Holi connotes: 1. Past is past, i.e., one shouldn't be worried about what has already happened, but should pay attention on future, by doing everything in the divine remembrance of God, i.e., yogyukt. 2. 'Ho-li' means what has already happened, in Hindi. I, the soul, have now surrendered myself to God Shiva; therefore, from now onward I will perform all my deeds as per God's directions advice. 3. Holi is or pronounced similar to the word Holy in English, which means to be pure; therefore, the Karmas performed by us should not be influenced by any vice. Thus, the festival of Holi inspires us in many ways.

Colours on Holi

Knowledge also symbolizes colour. A knowledgeable person colours those who are in his company, i.e., he gives the spiritual knowledge to other souls and tells them the method of forging their mental and intellectual link with God and receiving powers from Him.

Human beings can't be blissful unless they colour themselves as well as others with the colour of Knowledge. It is only through one's blissful communion with God that we can experience divine delights. How can a human soul experience communion with God? Nowadays, ignorant or human beings, vicious influenced by Sex-Lust, Anger, Greed, Attachment and Ego, become a cause of misery and misfortune for others. One can experience the delightful communion only when the Ocean of Knowledge cleanses the soul, i.e., burns the vicesnegativity or polluted traits of the soul-in the fire of Knowledge and Godly Remembrance. This is the true Holi.

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
